

## Recycling and Disposal of Electrical and Electronic Equipment

### How to dispose of Electrical and Electronic equipment

As a rule, electrical and electronic equipment (EEE) shouldn't be disposed of along with household waste. EEE may contain hazardous substances which, if exposed, could cause a serious and detrimental effect on the environment, wildlife and human health.

This symbol on the product(s) and / or accompanying documents means that used electrical and electronic products should not be mixed with general household waste. For proper treatment, recovery and recycling, please take this product(s) to designated collection points where it will be accepted free of charge.



If you would like to dispose of electrical or electronic equipment for recycling, we recommend that you:

- Donate the unwanted item to a charitable organisation
- Take it to a Designated Collection Facility (DCF) run by your local authority
- Take part in national recycling campaigns

You can dispose of old electrical or electronic equipment at your local waste facilities or recycling centres. Please contact your local authority directly for more information.

Alternatively, in some countries you may be able to return your products to your local retailer upon purchase of an equivalent new product.
